#### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During  $3^{rd}$  week of 2024, 2277 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 2951, in 26 districts during the  $2^{nd}$  week. There is a 22.8% decrease in  $3^{rd}$  week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 32.2% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 6.1%, rest of the Colombo District – 14.8 %, Gampaha District – 8.3% and Kalutara District – 3.0%]. Jaffna [23.1%], Kandy [6.6%], Galle [5.3%], Batticaloa [4.7%], Kurunegala [4.6%], Puttalam [4.3%] and Kegalle [4.0%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

#### **HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)**

During 3<sup>rd</sup> week, 60 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 23 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 52 MOH areas in both 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 3<sup>rd</sup> week are Alayadivembu, Kalmunai North, Muttur, Alawwa, Kayts, Ruwanwella, Bope Poddala and Hikkaduwa. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 2<sup>nd</sup> week and not flagged for the current week are MC Matale, Akkaraipattu, Polgahawela, Chilaw, Mahawewa, Nattandiya, Mullaitivu, Dehiovita, Boralesgamuwa, Minuwangoda and Bandaragama.

#### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

\* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 2<sup>nd</sup> week shows an increase from 862 to 863.

In 3<sup>rd</sup> week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 784. In 25 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 31 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the  $3^{rd}$  week are illustrated in Table 3.
