DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 41, 1178 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1152 cases in 24 districts during the week 40. There is a 2.3% increase in week 41, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 47.0% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.8%, Rest of the Colombo District – 15.5%, Gampaha District – 22.0% and Kalutara District – 4.7%]. Kandy [10.2%], Puttalam [7.7%], Rathnapura [4.5%], and Jaffna [3.7%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Thirty-one MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 41. Out of them, 08 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in week 41 compared to the week 40, and another 21 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 41 and 40 (Table 2).

In week 41 high risk levels of Kahathuduwa, Mirigama, Beruwala (NIHS), Gampola, Harispattuwa, Waththegama, MC Matale, Akmeemana, MC Jaffna, Addalaichchenai and Mawanella MOH areas have come down while Divulapitiya, Akuressa, Mahawewa, Badulla, Eheliyagoda and Akkaraipattu MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 468 and 421 during the weeks 40 and 41 respectively. In 32 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased in the week 41 when compared with the previous week (Table 3).

*Average midnight total of the 40th week shows an increase from 463 to 468 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
