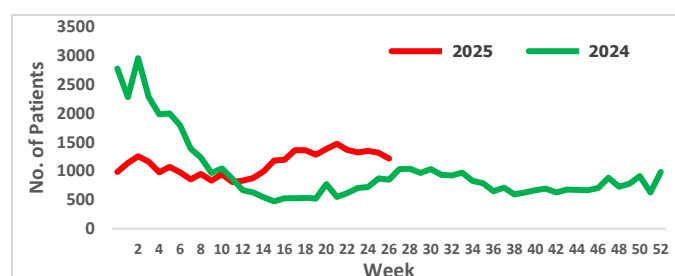

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 26th week, 1215 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1312 in 26 districts during the 25th week. There is 7.4% decrease in 26th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 49.1% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council - 6.1%, rest of the Colombo District - 20.7%, Gampaha District - 16.1% and Kalutara District - 6.2%]. Kandy [14.8%], Rathnapura [8.9%], Galle [5.2%], Matara [3.5%], Kurunegala [3.1%], and Kegalle [3.0%] districts also have reported higher proportions of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 26th week, 32 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. 22 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 23 MOH areas in both 25th and 26th week of 2025.

Balangoda, Kuruvita, Rathnapura PS, CMC- D2A, CMC- D2B, CMC-D3, CMC- D4, Egodauiyana, Kahathuduwa, Piliyandala, Divulapitiya, and Gampaha newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 26th week. Ambalantota, Baddegama, Elpitiya, MC Galle, Gampola, Elapatha, Nivithigala, Battaramulla, Hanwella, Nugegoda, Moratuwa, Katana, Kayts, and Kurunegala MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 25th week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

** After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 25th week shows an increase from 486 to 493.*

In the 26th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 443. In 10 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 32 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 26th week are illustrated in Table 3.

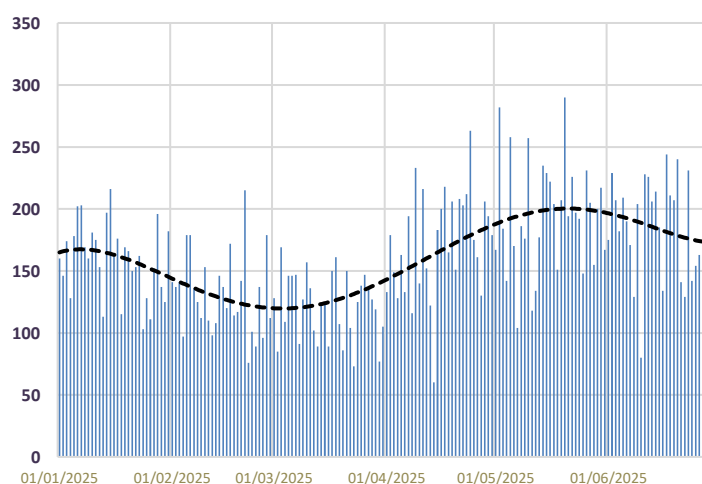
