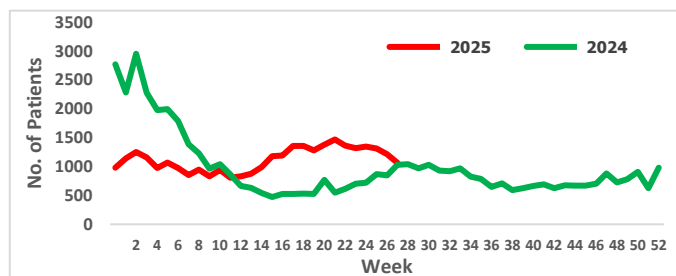

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 27th week, 1061 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1215 in 24 districts during the 26th week. There is 12.7% decrease in 27th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 41.0% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council - 6.1%, rest of the Colombo District - 15.7%, Gampaha District - 14.5% and Kalutara District - 4.6%]. Kandy [14.1%], Rathnapura [10.5%], Kurunegala [5.3%], Galle [5.1%], and Matara [3.3%] districts also have reported higher proportions of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 27th week, 27 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. 15 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 18 MOH areas in both 26th and 27th week of 2025.

Udunuwara, Kurunegala, MC Galle, Tangalle, Monaragala, CMC-D1, Moratuwa and Katana newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 27th week. MC Matara, Werellagama, Rathnapura PS, CMC- D2B, CMC-D3, CMC- D4, Egodaunya, Kahathuduwa, Homagama, Kolonnawa, Pitakotte, Divulapitiya, and Gampaha MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 26th week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 26th week shows a decrease from 443 to 441.

In the 27th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 416. In 20 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 26 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 27th week are illustrated in Table 3.
