DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 45, 1053 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1114 cases in 24 districts during the week 44. There is an 5.5% decrease in week 45, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 42.5% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.8%, Rest of the Colombo District – 11.5%, Gampaha District – 20.7% and Kalutara District – 5.4%]. Kandy [10.5%], Puttalam [8.0%] and Badulla [4.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Twenty- five MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 45. Out of them, 8 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in week 45 compared to the week 44, and another 18 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 45 and 44 (Table 2).

In week 45 high risk levels of Piliyandala, Homagama, Pita Kotte, Gothatuwa, Biyagama, Divulapitiya, Katana, Mahara, Mirigama, Kalutara (NIHS), Harispattuwa, Wattegama, Nallur, Mahawewa and Warakapola MOH areas have come down while Mc Negombo, Panadura, Yatinuwara, Karandeniya, Mannar and Puttalam MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 447 and 454 during the weeks 44 and 45 respectively. In 27 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 23 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 45 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of admissions in the week 45 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 44th week shows an increase from 442 to 447 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
