

WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

10th January 2021—16th January 2022 National Dengue Control Unit, Ministry of Health



DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 02, 2081 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 2057 cases in 25 districts during the week 01. There is a 1.2% increase in week 02, compared to the previous week. Of all cases 54.1% were reported from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 9.1%, Rest of the Colombo District – 16.3%, Gampaha District – 21.2% and Kalutara District – 7.5%] (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Eighty-four MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 02. Out of them, 21 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in week 02 compared to the week 01, and another 44 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 01 and 02 (Table 2).

In week 02 high risk level of Padukka, Kesbewa, Wadduwa, Wattegama, Bope, Hikkaduwa, Morawaka, MC Matara, Kinniya, Valachchenai, Kuliyapitiya, Pannala, Udubaddawa, Nattandiya, Bandarawela, Haputale, Balangoda, Dehiowita and Warakapola MOH areas have come down while Bulathsinhala, Poojapiyita, Balapitiya, Karandeniya, Tangalle, Walasmulla, Nallur, Chavakachcheri, Vavuniya, Ibbagamuwa, Dankotuwa, Madampe and Kegalle MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 69 hospitals throughout the country was 762* and 701 during the weeks 01 and 02 respectively. In 23 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased in the week 02 when compared with the previous week (Table 3).

*Average midnight total of the 01st week shows an increase from 681 to 762 when compared to the previous week's report after updating with delayed reports
