DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 15, 775 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 958 cases in 24 districts during the week 14. There is a 19.1% decrease in week 15, compared to the previous week. The decrease may be due to under reporting due to public holidays. Of all reported cases 36.7% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 2.2%, Rest of the Colombo District – 16.1%, Gampaha District – 9.4% and Kalutara District – 8.9%]. Jaffna [6.2%], Ratnapura [8.0%], Kegalle [6.2%] and Galle [8.3%] districts also has reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Forty-six MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 15. Out of them, 14 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in week 15 compared to the week 14, and another 14 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 14 and 15 (Table 2).

In week 15 high risk level of Pitakotte, Gampaha, Seeduwa, Mathugama, Wadduwa, Harispattuwa, Bope Poddala, Chavakachcheri, Tellippalai, Nallur, Uduvil, Velanai, Uppuveli, Chenkalady and Pannala MOH areas have come down while Piliyandala, Bandaragama, Horana, MC Kandy, Koralai Pattu Central, Kalpitiya, MC Rathnapura, Dehiovita, Galigamuwa and Kegalle MOH Areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 69 hospitals throughout the country was 303* and 258 during the weeks 14 and 15 respectively. In 25 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased in the week 15 when compared with the previous week (Table 3).

*Average midnight total of the 14th week shows an increase from 302 to 303 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
