DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 06, 1672 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1889 cases in 25 districts during the week 05. There is a 11.5% decrease in week 06, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 48.4% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 5.9%, Rest of the Colombo District – 15.8%, Gampaha District – 20.0% and Kalutara District – 6.6%]. Puttalam [9.0%], Kalmunai [5.1%] and Rathnapura [4.5%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Forty-eight MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 06. Out of them, 05 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 06 compared to the week 05, and another 43 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 06 and 05 (Table 2).

In week 06 high risk levels of Homagama, Kolonnawa, Divulapitiya, Beruwala (NIHS), Nallur, Addalaichchenai, Chenkalady, Arachchikattuwa, Dankotuwa, Wennappuwa, Badulla and Kuruwita MOH areas have come down while Bandaragama, Gampola, Telippalai, Trincomalee, Eheliyagoda, Warakapola, Alayadivembu and Sainthamaruthu MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 75 hospitals throughout the country was 649 and 604 during the weeks 05 and 06 respectively. In 28 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 29 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 06 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of admissions in the week 06 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 05th week shows an increase from 642 to 649 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
