DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 09, 1438 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1663 cases in 26 districts during the week 08. There is a 13.5% decrease in week 09, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 54.0% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 5.8%, Rest of the Colombo District – 16.8%, Gampaha District – 25.7% and Kalutara District – 5.8%]. Puttalam [8.1%], Batticaloa [5.1%], Rathnapura [4.1%] and Trincomalee [3.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Forty-two MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 09. Out of them, 08 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 09 compared to the week 08, and another 34 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 09 and 08 (Table 2).

In week 09, high risk levels of Nugegoda, Boralesgamuwa, Bandaragama, Kalutara (NIHS), MC Kandy, Talatuoya, Yatinuwara, Akuressa, MC Galle, Chavakachcheri, Akkaraipattu, Sammanthurai, Addalaichchenai, Bingiriya, Badulla, Kegalle, Mawanella, Ruwanwella, Embilipitiya and PS Rathnapura MOH areas have come down while Mirigama, Beruwala (NIHS), Point Pedro, Vavuniya, Eravur, Korali Pattu Central, Nattandiya and MC Rathnapura areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 597 and 569 during the weeks 08 and 09 respectively. In 33 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 20 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 09 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the week 09 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 08th week shows an increase from 596 to 597 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
