DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 22, 2396 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 2289 cases in 26 districts during the week 21. There is a 4.7% increase in week 22, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 50.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council -5.6%, Rest of the Colombo District - 15.6%, Gampaha District -21.7% and Kalutara District - 8.1%]. Kandy [8.6%], Rathnapura [4.9%], Kegalle [4.4%] and Kurunegala [4.3%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Sixty-seven MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 22. Out of them, 28 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 22 compared to the week 21, and another 39 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 22 and 21 (Table 2).

In week 22, high risk levels of Mathugama, Doluwa, Talathuoya, Wattegama, MC Matale, Korali Pattu (Central), Aranayaka, Dehiovita, Balapitiya and MC Galle MOH areas have come down. Padukka, Kahathuduwa, Wadduwa, Poojapitiya, Walasmulla, Sooriyawewa, Okewela, Akuressa, Mulatiyana, Mullaitivu, Mutur, Pannala, Kuruwita, Rambukkana, Warakapola, Yatiyantota and Bulathkohupitiya MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 880 and 951 during the weeks 21 and 22 respectively. In 27 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 30 hospitals the average mid night total has decreased in the week 22 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the week 22 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 21st week shows an increase from 868 to 880 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
