### WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During 47<sup>th</sup> week, 1969 suspected dengue cases were reported in 23 districts in comparison to 1810, in 24 districts during the 46<sup>th</sup> week. There is 8.78% increase in 47<sup>th</sup> week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 34.5% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 3.7%, rest of the Colombo District – 14.6%, Gampaha District -12.8% and Kalutara District – 3.4%]. Kandy [17.0%], Galle [8.0%], Matale [6.0%], Kurunegala [5.7%], Badulla [5.7%], Puttalama [5.5%], Ratnapura [3.8%] and Kegalle [3.5%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

#### HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 47<sup>th</sup> week, 54 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 32 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 39 MOH areas in both 46<sup>th</sup> and 47<sup>th</sup> weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 47<sup>th</sup> week are Attanagalla, Gampaha, Mirigama, Ragama, Poojapitiya, Menikhinna, Ukuwela, MC Matale, Baddegama, Bope (Poddala), MC Matara, MC Jaffna, Badulla and Godakawela. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 46<sup>th</sup> week and not flagged for the current week are; Piliyandala, Kaduwela, Katana, Mahara, Ingiriya, Talatuoya, Habaraduwa and Rathgama.

### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

# \* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 46<sup>th</sup> week shows a decrease from 812 to 810.

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 844 in 47<sup>th</sup> week. In 31 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 20 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 47<sup>th</sup> week are illustrated in Table 3.

### **KEY ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED DURING WEEK 47 AT NATIONAL LEVEL**

- The new National Dengue Surveillance System (NaDSys) is being introduced island-wide which is more comprehensive and robust. The present Dengue Sentinel Site Surveillance (DenSyS) will be replaced with the new system; Training of REs, MOOH, ICNOs and PHII has already been completed in Colombo, Gampaha, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Matale, Ratnapura, Kegalle, Galle, Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa, Jaffna, Vavuniya, Mannar, Mullaitivu, Kilinochchi, Badulla, Moneragala, Trincomalee, Ampara, Batticaloa, Puttalam, Kegalle, Kurunegala and Hambanthota districts.
- In view of the local outbreaks in Kandy District, extensive entomological surveys were conducted in high-risk MOH areas, targeting the public institutions and intersectoral actions were strengthened for dengue prevention and sustainable control.
