# WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

Week 48 (27<sup>th</sup> November – 03<sup>rd</sup> December 2023) National Dengue Control Unit, Ministry of Health

#### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During 48<sup>th</sup> week, 2472 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 1969, in 23 districts during the 47<sup>th</sup> week. There is 25.5% increase in 48<sup>th</sup> week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 35.5% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.1%, rest of the Colombo District – 15.9%, Gampaha District -12.0% and Kalutara District – 3.4%]. Kandy [14.4%], Jaffna [8.4%], Badulla [6.1%], Kurunegala [5.6%], Galle [5.4%], Puttalama [4.9%], Kegalle [4.2%] and Batticaloa [3.6%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

#### HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 48<sup>th</sup> week, 61 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 32 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 52 MOH areas in both 47<sup>th</sup> and 48<sup>th</sup> weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 48<sup>th</sup> week are Piliyandala, Homagama, Kaduwela, Kolonnawa, Hanwella, Egoda Uyana, Mahara, Minuwangoda, Gampola, Habaraduwa, Kopay, Point Pedro, Nallur, Sandilipay, Karaveddy, Hali Ela and Batticaloa. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 47<sup>th</sup> week and not flagged for the current week are; Boralesgamuwa, Poojapitiya, Akmeemana, Baddegama, Bope (Poddala), Matale, Ukuwela, MC Matale, MC Matara and Godakawela.

#### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

\* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the  $47^{th}$  week shows an increase from 844 to 845.

In 48<sup>th</sup> week Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 949. In 34 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 20 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the  $48^{th}$  week are illustrated in Table 3.
