WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 49th week, 2730 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 2472, in 26 districts during the 48th week. There is 10.4% increase in 49th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 34.7% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 3.5%, rest of the Colombo District - 17.8%, Gampaha District - 9.4% and Kalutara District - 4.0%]. Kandy [14.6%], Jaffna [11.2%], Badulla [6.9%], Puttalam [5.7%], Kurunegala [5.1%], Kegalle [4.0%], Galle [3.7%] and Batticaloa [3.1%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 49th week, 65 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 41 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 59 MOH areas in both 48th and 49th weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 49th week are Bandaragama, Akurana, Poojapitiya, Beliatta, Chavakachcheri, Uduvil, Karaveddy, Kuliyapitiya, Chilaw and Dehiowita. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 48th week and not flagged for the current week are; Pita Kotte, Minuwangoda, Mirigama, Ragama and MC Kurunegala.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 48th week shows an increase from 949 to 1011.

In 49th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 1011. In 32 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 26 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 49^{th} week are illustrated in Table 3.
