DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 3^{rd} week, 1158 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1249 in 25 districts during the 2^{nd} week. There is 7.3% decrease in 3^{rd} week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 46.8% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 12.6%, rest of the Colombo District – 15.4%, Gampaha District – 14.1% and Kalutara District – 4.7%]. Ratnapura [7.6%], Batticaloa [7.1%], Kandy [6.7%], Matale [3.7%], and Galle [3.2%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 3rd week of 2025, 19 MOH areas were flagged as highrisk;12 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 13 MOH areas in both 2nd and 3rd week of 2025.

Muthur, Kopay, Balangoda, Hambantota, Nugegoda, Mahara and Wattala newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 3rd week. Kinniya, MC Kandy, Matale MC, Batticaloa, Korale Pattu Central, Battaramulla, Mirigama, Negombo, and Ja-Ela MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 2nd week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 2nd week shows an increase from 379 to 389.

In the 3rd week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 384. In 22 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 29 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 3^{rd} week are illustrated in Table 3.
