

# WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

#### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During 7<sup>th</sup> week, 851 suspected dengue cases were reported in 23 districts in comparison to 972 in 25 districts during the 6<sup>th</sup> week. There is 12.4% decrease in 7<sup>th</sup> week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 47.8% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 17.6%, rest of the Colombo District – 14.0%, Gampaha District – 13.4% and Kalutara District – 2.8%]. Kandy [8.0%], Batticaloa [5.8%], Galle [5.1%], Puttalam [4.9%], Rathnapura [4.1%], Matara [3.3%], and Kegalle [3.3%], districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

#### HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 7<sup>th</sup> week of 2025, 13 MOH areas were flagged as highrisk; 8 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 6 MOH areas in both 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> week of 2025.

Eravur, Oddamavadi, Gothatuwa, Kolonnawa, and Nugegoda newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 7<sup>th</sup> week. Muthur, Kinniya, MC Kandy, Yatinuwara, Kaduwela, Maharagama, Pitakotte, Ja-Ela, Attanagalla, and Mirigama MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 6<sup>th</sup> week, were not flagged in the current week.

#### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

\* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 6<sup>th</sup> week shows a decrease from 395 to 357.

In the 7<sup>th</sup> week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 325. In 13 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 23 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the  $7^{th}$  week are illustrated in Table 3.
