

# WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During 19<sup>th</sup> week, 1281 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1358 in 25 districts during the 18<sup>th</sup> week. There is 5.7% decrease in 19<sup>th</sup> week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 45.0% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council - 9.1%, rest of the Colombo District - 18.9%, Gampaha District - 13.0% and Kalutara District - 4.1%]. Rathnapura [19.6%], Kandy [7.3%], Batticaloa [5.2%], Galle [4.1%], Kegalle [3.4%], and Trincomalee [3.1%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

#### HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 19<sup>th</sup> week, 37 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk; 16 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 31 MOH areas in both 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> week of 2025.

Kandy MC, Yatinuwara, Battaramulla, Homagama, Moratuwa, Piliyandala, Negombo, Bandaragama, and Panadura newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 19<sup>th</sup> week. Eheliyagoda, Imbulpe, Kinniya, Nugegoda, Boralesgamuwa, Rathmalana, Attanagalla, Mirigama, Minuwangoda, and Ragama MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 18<sup>th</sup> week, were not flagged in the current week.

#### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

\* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 18<sup>th</sup> week shows an increase from 476 to 490.

In the 19<sup>th</sup> week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 378. In 25 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 20 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the  $19^{th}$  week are illustrated in Table 3.
